

Every Learner Everywhere: The goal of the **Every Learner Everywhere** service is to build capacity among faculty and staff to expand equity and improve student outcomes through evidence-based and student-centered teaching practices. The five-service phase began in April 2022, laying the groundwork for transformative change. After pausing for the summer, cross-functional teams from **Clemson University**,

Montana State University, New Mexico State University, the University of New Orleans, and Rutgers University-Newark, have entered the final phase, Iterating and Scaling, in which they'll focus on strategies for scaling personnel, technology, and professional development across the institution. It encompasses cross-institutional collaboration and sharing in addition to applying a continuous improvement approach.

The first session on September 12 reflected on the implementation experience, examining strengths, challenges, and opportunities. Participants shared successes and lessons learned from the implementation, as well as preliminary data and results. There were discussions around identifying effective practices to support scaling, approaches to guide efforts, stakeholders to involve, and spreading initiatives more broadly across the institution in a sustainable way. Three subsequent sessions will dig deeper into data and outcomes to shape next steps, before pivoting to sustainability and how to ensure these changes last. Participants will develop their action plans for refining and expanding their interventions, culminating in what are sure to be exciting presentations to showcase their work! Our colleagues will be well supported in evaluating interventions, identifying necessary modifications, and preparing to scale promising practices by the ELE team and coaches.

Core Data Metrics Deadline Extended to October 2: We're in the final stretch of the 2023 Core Data Metrics collection. This vital information serves multiple purposes: it gauges our collective strides in degree completion and reducing equity gaps, allows institutions to self-assess on pivotal student success metrics, and equips APLU with the means to identify larger educational trends, especially when the data is

disaggregated by various student demographics (race/ethnicity, gender, Pell status, etc.). The deadline for submission has been extended to **Friday, October 2**.
