## **SERVICE UPDATE**



Every Learner Everywhere: The ELE cohort recently held their second online session for the *Iterating* and *Scaling* phase of the project. Participants from Clemson University, Montana State University, New Mexico State University, the University of New Orleans, and Rutgers University—Newark are in the process of evaluating the outcomes of the evidence-based teaching practices they implemented and

determining how to expand the most effective elements. The teams had productive discussions about revising their interventions based on learnings so far. They shared ideas for iterating approaches to better support student success. There was also dialogue around potential strategies to scale the initiatives more broadly at their campuses. The session provided valuable opportunities for the cohort to exchange knowledge and collaborate on continuous improvement. Overall, it marked an important step forward as they work to build on their progress and impacts. The last two sessions are scheduled for the month of November, and as the project nears completion, the teams are focused on reflecting on their journeys to integrate new evidence-based instruction practices on their campuses. For the final session on November 28, they are preparing presentations that will synthesize takeaways to inform future efforts to advance student-centered and equitable teaching and learning practices. We are very much looking forward to seeing the presentations and testing their collective storytelling skills!
