**2024 Core Data Metrics Collection Closing Soon:** We are collecting year 5 of the Core Data Metrics (CDM). APLU uses the CDM to measure progress towards our degree completion and equity goals. By using **VSA Analytics**, institutions may see the data for their institution and their Powered by Publics peers. It becomes a particularly valuable resource as we look at disaggregating success metrics by various subgroups. Detailed guidance, including a data
